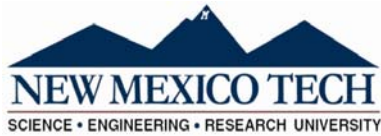

Applicants should submit a CV, research plan indicating equipment needs, statement of teaching philosophy and interests, and list of 3 references as one pdf file.
